FROM THE PASTOR’S DESK

Fourth Sunday of Easter, Year C

Paul and Barnabas were on their first missionary journey to Asia Minor (present day Turkey). On the Sabbath, Paul and Barnabas entered the synagogue at Antioch in Pisidia where they were invited to give a word of exhortation to the people. They explained that since Christ had been rejected by the Jews, Christians were obliged to preach the Gospel to all the nations, thus emphasizing the universal mission of Christianity.

In other words, since the Jews had rejected the word of God, it was being offered to the Gentiles. But those Jews in Antioch who opposed the idea of preaching to the Gentiles got enough of a following to expel the apostles from their territory. Nevertheless, Paul and Barnabas remained faithful to the Gospel that Jesus had revealed. They “*were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit*” and continued to preach to the Gentiles who welcomed them with delight (v. 48).

The mission of the Church is indeed a continuation of the ministry of salvation begun by Jesus. Is the seed of the Gospel still being sown to the ends of the earth? Are the poor, the blind, the deaf, the lame, the hungry, the thirsty, the lost and the imprisoned still the primary focus of our service?

Little wonder Jesus introduces himself as the Good Shepherd of his flock in today’s Gospel. To bring his message home, Jesus makes three claims. He knows his sheep, and his sheep hears his voice. Second, he gives eternal life to us, his sheep by receiving us into his sheepfold and giving us Faith through Baptism, and then he strengthens that Faith in Confirmation. Third, he protects his sheep by placing them in the loving hands of his Almighty Father. Without him to guide us and protect

us, *we* are an easy prey for the *spiritual wolves* of this world, including Satan and his minions. And we are called like the Apostles to go beyond trenches; *become good shepherds and good sheep, good leaders and good followers.*
