REFLECTION

Thomas, the “doubting” apostle, makes the great profession of Faith in today’s Gospel reading. He appears to be the most outrageous doubter of the Resurrection of Jesus, yet he utters the greatest confession of belief: “My Lord and my God.” This declaration by the “doubting” Thomas in today’s Gospel is very significant for two reasons. First, it is the foundation of our Christian Faith. Our Faith is based on the Divinity of Jesus as proved by His miracles, especially by the supreme miracle of His Resurrection from the dead. Second, Thomas’ Faith culminated in his self-surrender to Jesus, his heroic missionary expedition to India in A.D. 52, his fearless preaching, and the powerful testimony given by his martyrdom in A.D. 72.

This calls us to ask God for the faith that culminates in self-surrender to God and leads us to serve those we encounter with love. Thomas’ proclamation suggests a living faith stirred through the resurrection of Christ. This faith serves as an example that enables us to see the Risen Lord in everyone. It gives us the willingness to render to each one our loving service, for “*Faith without good works is dead,*” (James 2:17).

May we grow our faith in Jesus Christ and, like Thomas, even to the point of suffering martyrdom. Furthermore, making this proclamation our mantra should ignite us to come to know Jesus personally and intimately by our daily and meditative reading of the Bible. Let it strengthen our Faith by the power of the Holy Spirit through our personal and community prayer and share in the Divine life of Jesus by frequenting the Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Holy Eucharist. Let Jesus’ resurrection stir in us the desire to believe, pray, love, and

serve God and one another in Christ. Only then would we put our love of God into action.

Moreover, as we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, let us accept God’s invitation to celebrate and practice mercy. One way the Church celebrates God’s mercy throughout the year is through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Finding time for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is another good way to receive Divine Mercy. Additionally, the Gospel command is, “*Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.*” This demands that we show mercy to our fellow human beings. May we radiate God’s mercy to others by our actions, our words, and our prayers. Nonetheless, take time to practice the corporal and spiritual works of mercy in your community and surrounding areas as a way of solidifying the divine love in you.
